# **Weight Omissions**

### PAGE 16 - SIZE AND WEIGHT

#2. Applying Disqualifications: Disqualifying weights for adult specimens shall apply at all times but do allowance should be made for decreased weights in adult birds in the molt during late summer and fall season. Disqualifying weights for young specimens shall not apply until December 1<sup>st</sup>.

## PAGE 22 - GENERAL DISQUALIFICATIONS - WEIGHTS

Weight is a breed characteristic. Any bird (except Beltsville Small White Turkeys) that deviates more than 20% either up or down from the weight listed for its' breed, sex, and age should be disqualified. Example – in a bird with a standard weight of 5 pounds, a range of 4 to 6 pounds is within the scope of "the standard weight". This rule applies to all large fowl, bantams, ducks, geese, Guinea Fowl, and Turkeys (except Beltsville Small Whites).

BLUE – MALE AND FEMALE: (Page 28) In all sections preference to be given to a medium shade of clear blue, free from lacing, shafting, mealiness and messiness, with no contrast in color between any of the sections, a harmonious blending of all sections desired; the male sex feathers of hackle, back, saddle, and wing-bows carrying a metallic gloss of the same basic hue of the general plumage, free from green, purple, or bronze sheen.

- PAGE 418 EMBDEN GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 418 TOULOUSE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 419 BUFF TOULOUSE GEESE DISQUALIFICATIONS: Remove solid white feathers in primaries or secondaries.
- PAGE 419 BUFF TOULOUSE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 420 GRAY TOULOUSE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.

- PAGE 422 PILGRIM GEESE STANDARD WEIGHTS: Change Old Goose weight to 13 lbs.

- PAGE 428 CANADA GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 428- CHINESE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS Remove entire section.
- PAGE 430- BROWN CHINESE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 430 WHITE CHINESE GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 431- EGYPTIAN GEESE DISQUALIFICATIONS: Change to: Clipped flights or pinioned wing to prevent flying shall not handicap the specimen. (See "Disqualifications" on page 22 and "Cutting For Defects" on page 19.)
- PAGE 431 EGYPTIAN GEESE COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.
- PAGE 432 TUFTED ROMAN GEESE DISQUALIFICATIONS: Change to: *Absence of tuft.* Feathers other than pure white in any part of plumage except young specimens which show

traces of gray in body plumage. Distinctly yellow bills and feet, black in the bean of either sex. (See "Disqualifications" on page 22 and "Cutting For Defects" on page 19.)

PAGE 432 - TUFTED ROMAN GEESE - COMMON DEFECTS: Remove entire section.

#### **TURKEYS**

PAGE 356 – Add to the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> paragraph ...*United States, with the possible exception of the White Holland. The Bronze is the largest and heaviest variety.* 

PAGE 357 - TAIL - Coverts broad and abundant extending well onto tail.

PAGE 357 - BREAST & KEEL - Add ...full fleshed, throughout its entire length.

PAGE 357 - BODY - Remove slightly convex profile to sides.

PAGE 358 - BELTSVILLE SMALL WHITE - THROAT - WATTLES: Change bluish to pinkish.

PAGE 358 - BLACK & BOURBON RED: Hen weights should be 18 pounds.

PAGE 360 – BRONZE: Under weights add: When two specimens are both over standard weight and equal in all other points, the one nearest standard weight shall win.

PAGE 360 – BRONZE – TAIL – MAIN TAIL AND COVERTS: Add ... the wider the better,  $\it lustrous$  copper band...

PAGE 361 - NARRAGANSETT: Hen weight should be 18 pounds.

PAGE 361 – TAIL – COVERTS AND LESSER COVERTS: Dull black, each feather regularly penciled with parallel lines of tan, having a wide band of metallic black, free from bronze cast, extending across it near the end, terminating in a wide edging of light steel-gray approaching white.

PAGE 362 – SECONDARIES: Change *tip* to *top* and add ... in secondaries *being* very objectionable.

PAGE 362 - ROYAL PALM - TAIL - MAIN TAIL: Band in tail should be 1 inch in width.

PAGE 363 – ROYAL PALM – COVERTS: Replace across each feather with on end of each feather.

PAGE 363 – ROYAL PALM – COLOR – FEMALE: Change *lass* to *less* and replace last sentence with: *The more edging in neck and upper shoulders of female, the better the specimen; all other points being equal.* 

PAGE 363 - SLATE - DISQUALIFICATONS: Replace section with part.

PAGE 364 - WHITE HOLLAND - THROAT-WATTLE: Replace bluish with pinkish.

#### **HELMETED GUINEA FOWL**

PAGE 365 - Replace *Daienira* with *Deianira*.

PAGE 365 - JUDGING GUINEA FOWL: Remove last sentence of second paragraph.

PAGE 366 – SHAPE – MALE – BACK: Remove *Long* and add: *When showing, the carriage of the Guinea Fowl is upright.* 

PAGE 366 – SHAPE – MALE – BODY: Change to *Fairly* long, well rounded and solid; carriage, upright.

PAGE 366 - SHAPE - MALE - PRIMARIES AND SECONDARIES: Remove the entire section.

PAGE 366 - SHAPE - MALE - TAIL: Change to: Relatively short, carried low.

PAGE 366 - SHAPE - MALE - SHANKS: Add Relatively short, ...

PAGE 366 - SHAPE - MALE - FLUFF: Remove this section.

PAGE 366 – SHAPE – MALE – LOWER THIGHS: Remove concealed by body plumage.

PAGE 366 – LAVENDER – COLOR – MALE AND FEMALE: Remove all sections and replace with: The pattern is identical to that of the Pearl, the ground color of the plumage is light gray or lavender. Shanks and toes are light gray to orange. Indistinct barring and/or indistinct pearls in the wing feathers is a defect.

PAGE 367 – PEARL – COLOR – MALE AND FEMALE – INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH: Add: Indistinct barring and/or indistinct pearls in the wings is a defect.

PAGE 367 - COLOR - PEARL - BEAK: Add, darker at the base.

PAGE 368 – COLOR – PEARL: Remove section labeled NECK and replace with HACKLE: The hackle and front of the lower neck show fine, blue-gray feathers without pearls or bars. When seen in sunlight, these feathers show some iridescence.

PAGE 368 - COLOR - PEARL - FRONTS, BOWS AND COVERTS: Remove this section.

PAGE 368 - COLOR - PEARL - BREAST: Add .... good size, well rounded pearls throughout.

PAGE 368 – COLOR – WHITE: Remove all sections and replace with: Plumage is pure white throughout all sections on ideal specimens, in both male and female. Black hair feathers on the lower neck and hackle, however, are acceptable, but not preferred. Black flecking or a yellow cast to the plumage is a serious defect. Shanks and toes are orange; spotty shanks and toes are a defect. The eyes are light bay to brown.

#### **HEAVY DUCKS**

PAGE 374 - MUSCOVY DUCKS - COMMON DEFECTS: No "Common Defects" should be listed. PAGE 375 - MUSCOVY DUCKS - BLACK MUSCOVY DUCKS - COLOR - DRAKE AND DUCK - BILL: Replace with *Pink*, *shaded with horn*.

PAGE 378 – MUSCOVY DUCKS – WHITE MUSCOVY DUCKS – DISQUALIFICAIONS: Replace with Feathers other than pure white in any part of plumage, except dark markings commonly found on the head of young specimens (see also "Disqualifications – Muscovy Ducks" on page 374).

PAGE 381 – SAXONY DUCKS – COLOR – DRAKE – BILL: Replace with *Yellow to greenish yellow* (yellow preferred); dark bean in sexually mature birds not a point deduction.

PAGE 381 – SAXONY DUCKS – COLOR – DRAKE – NECK: Add (Note a break in the with ring at the cack of the neck is a common fault worth a 1 point deduction.

PAGE 382 – SAXONY DUCKS – COLOR – DUCK – NECK: Add (Note – white fully encircling the neck is a significant fault worth a 3 point deduction.)

PAGE 378 - WHITE MUSCOVY DUCKS – DISQUALIFICATIONS: Feathers other than pure white in any part of the plumage, except dark markings commonly found on the head of the young specimens. (See General Disqualifications and Cutting for Defects.)

#### MEDIUM DUCKS

PAGE 385- BLUE SWEDISH DUCKS – DISQUALIFICATIONS: Remove absence of white primary wing feathers on both wings.

 $PAGE\ 388-CRESTED\ DUCKS-SHAPE-DUCK\ AND\ DRAKE-BILL:\ Remove\ neatly\ straight\ in\ outline\ when\ viewed\ from\ the\ side.$ 

#### LIGHT DUCKS

PAGE 398 – RUNNER DUCKS – PENCILLED RUNNER DUCKS – DISQUALIFICATIONS: Remove *Bills clear yellow, blue or lead colored;*.

PAGE 398 – RUNNER DUCKS – PENCILLED RUNNER DUCKS – COLOR – DUCK – BILL: Replace with *Orangish yellow spotted with green when young, dull green when mature; bean, black.* 

PAGE 399 – WELSH HARLEQUIN DUCKS – SHAPE – DUCK AND DRAKE – BODY: Change to .... elevated twenty-five to thirty-five degrees (25° - 35°) above horizontal.

PAGE 399- WELSH HARLEQUIN DUCKS – SHAPE – DUCK AND DRAKE – SHANKS: Replace with Medium length and diameter; no preference given to birds with or without a line of small feathers on outside of shanks
